The Lind-Ritzville Cooperative Schools (LRCS) are at the heart of the Lind and Ritzville communities, located in the rolling wheat country of Adams County, Washington. Ritzville serves as the county seat, while Lind adds to the cooperative spirit that defines this region. Together, these communities embrace their agricultural heritage while fostering a strong sense of pride, engagement, and connection through their schools.

## A Strong School & Community Hub

LRCS serves as more than a school system—it is the center of community life. Residents actively partner with the district, attending events, utilizing facilities, and staying connected through a community email list. The schools host a variety of activities throughout the year,

including homecoming, athletic events, and celebrations that bring both towns together.

# Community Spirit & Annual Traditions

The Lind-Ritzville area is rich with traditions that highlight its close-knit and welcoming atmosphere. Annual favorites include:

- Wheat Land Communities' Fair (Labor Day Weekend) A regional highlight featuring livestock, exhibits, rodeo, entertainment, and fair food.
- Pop-Up at the Park A fall vendor fair hosted during Ritzville Alumni Weekend.
- Winter Fest A December holiday tradition with a tree lighting, caroling, Santa's visit, and festive community activities.

Other events, such as Fall Fest's Halloween Hunt, the Machines on Main car show, Lind Lighted Christmas Parade and a variety of other Chamber of Commerce activities, ensure there's always something happening to bring people together.

# A Welcoming Place to Call Home

Lind – With a population of about 569, Lind is a small, welcoming town rooted in agriculture. Residents enjoy a quiet pace of life, affordable housing, and strong community ties.

Ritzville – Home to nearly 2,000 people, Ritzville blends its role as a regional hub with a proud history. Its downtown is a National Historic District, and it is home to two museums, including the Northern Pacific Railway Depot. The town also houses the Washington Association of Wheat Growers headquarters, underscoring the area's deep agricultural roots.

# Overview of the Cooperative

Since 2012, the Lind and Ritzville School Districts have partnered in a unique academic cooperative. While each district remains independent, this collaboration expands opportunities for students through stronger academic programs, support services, and extracurricular activities than either district could provide alone.

#### School Structure

Each community operates its own elementary school (PK–5). Students join together for Lind-Ritzville Middle School (grades 6–8) in Lind and Lind-Ritzville High School (grades 9–12) in Ritzville. Each school has its own principal, with staff across the cooperative working closely to align curriculum, instruction, and student support. Shared professional development ensures quality teaching and learning at every level.

#### Leadership in a Cooperative

The Lind-Ritzville Cooperative Schools are guided by a single superintendent who provides cohesive leadership across both districts. Administrative services such as budgeting, payroll, transportation, maintenance, and extracurricular programs are also shared, ensuring efficiency and consistency.

Serving as superintendent in a cooperative district offers both challenge and reward. The role requires working with two boards of directors, leading collaborative initiatives, and wearing many hats in a small-district setting. At the same time, it offers the freedom to innovate, the chance to know students and families personally, and the opportunity to make a lasting impact in supportive communities with dedicated educators.
